A Message from the Chief Pharmacy Officer

It is my pleasure to present to you the Fiscal Year 2022 report for the Department of Pharmacy. This annual report highlights the exceptional work the Duke Pharmacy team does to care for our patients. This past year was another difficult one to navigate given the many challenges we are facing in healthcare. I am extremely proud of the resiliency and determination of our pharmacy team. We did not waiver in our commitment to care for our patients, our loved ones, and each other. In the support of our vision to be a global leader in pharmacy care, our team supported scholarship and research activities with 59 peer reviewed publications, grants, and abstracts presented. In support of our mission to deliver exceptional pharmacy service for a healthier tomorrow, our Population Health team made 8,620 patient, caregiver, and team member contacts to optimize medication therapy and patient care.

As we did our part to continue to help battle the COVID-19 pandemic, we prepared and administered 56,000 COVID-19 vaccines and distributed another 105,000 vaccine doses to our community providers and local public health departments. The Duke Compounding Facility prepared more than 660,000 sterile products to support patient care across DUHS. Our Investigation Drug Service had a productive and impactful year managing 638 active protocols. The Duke Children's Hospital and Health Center pharmacy team prepared 334,000 oral syringes and compounded 284,000 IV medications for our pediatric patients. The inpatient pharmacy team dispensed and stocked 9,000,000 million medication doses in our automated dispensing cabinets.

To continue to focus on being good stewards of our resources while managing the additional financial pressures of the pandemic, the Pharmacy Utilization Management Program (PUMP) realized \$6,700,000 in savings across the health system. Through our pharmacy contracting efforts, the team generated another \$5,100,000 in savings. In support of our formulary and medication management efforts, the Center for Medication Policy coordinated 100 medication formulary reviews and the Medication Safety group investigated over 7,100 adverse drug events.

As we continued to focus on providing excellent pharmacy services across the continuum of care, the Duke Home Care and Hospice pharmacy team made 26,000 medication deliveries to our patients at home. The Outpatient and Retail Pharmacy teams filled 492,000 prescriptions. They enrolled 7,500 patients in patient assistance programs to make their medications more affordable. The Retail Pharmacy team through our system Meds to Beds Program delivered 23,600 prescriptions to the bedside, putting crucial medications in the hands of our patients and providing medication education at the time of discharge.

These are just some highlights of the many accomplishments the DUHS Pharmacy Team had in Fiscal Year 2022. We have much to celebrate. I thank you all for your exceptional work. I am extremely proud of you for your perseverance, dedication, and contributions to the care of our patients.

We look forward to the new challenges which are ahead of us. We will continue to focus on system integration and alignment as we are *One Pharmacy, One Team, One Standard of Care for all Patients*.


