

Purpose

The PGY2 Ambulatory Care Pharmacy Residency at Duke University Hospital develops clinical practitioners with an expert-level evidence-based knowledge base in the area of chronic disease management. The resident is able to implement and manage new areas of pharmacy practice in the outpatient environment, conduct research in practical areas of ambulatory care pharmacy practice, become an expert in the education of pharmacy learners and other professions, and become a consummate professional leader in the field of ambulatory care pharmacy.

The Residency Experience

Required learning experiences include orientation, primary care (2 months), pharmacy administration, and population health. Additionally, two longitudinal (3 month) rotations are required throughout the year. Longitudinal anticoagulation clinic will be completed in the fall and one additional longitudinal clinic elective will be chosen for the spring.
